Here are a few of the things you can look forward to this year:

Sunday, November 4th

Our Silent Auction Fundraiser! This hugely important event is one of the mainstays of our continuing fiscal solvency. Browsing and bidding will take place before the concert and during the break, and will continue until 20 minutes after the concert has ended! In addition to extensive highlights from the entire *Christmas Oratorio*, we will sing Giovanni Gabrieli's *O Magnum Mysterium* as well as the glorious *Magnificat in D Major* by J.S. Bach. Enjoy the third different setting of the chorale *Nun Danket alle Gott* that the BCC has performed over the years, this time by Friedrich Zachau, as well as the Grande Motet *Te Deum* by the great middle Baroque composer Marc-Antoine Charpentier.

Sunday March 17th

For the Lenten concert this year, enjoy music by composers ranging from Thomas Tallis to our own artistic director Ralph Nelson. Bach's great *Concerto for Violin and Oboe in C Minor* (BWV 1060) showcasing our incredibly talented soloists Paul Pitkin, oboe and Mary Rowell, violin is our featured instrumental work of the year, and the choir will sing Chilcott's *Irish Blessing* and much more.

Sunday June 2nd

In honor of the 450th anniversary of the birth of John Dowland, guest artist Hideki Yamaya, lutenist and artistic director of Musica Maestrale (online at www.musicamasestrale.org), will perform selections by this great English composer. J.S Bach's *Wedding Cantata* and Durufle's *Ubi Caritas* are just two of the choral works you will hear at our season finale. Or is it...?

The Bach Cantata Choir has been extended the great honor of being asked to sing for the 42nd Annual Abbey Bach Festival in Mt. Angel. The Great Dane Returns to the BCC


One of the foremost influences on a young J.S. Bach, certainly from his perspective as an organist, was the master of that instrument from the Marien-Kirche in Lübeck, the great Dietrich Buxtehude. Bach took a lengthy leave of absence from his post as organist in Arnstadt to travel on foot more than 200 miles in the cold, wet North German autumn to study with Buxtehude; indeed he outstayed his leave by quite a bit and nearly lost his job because he couldn't tear himself away from the amazing opportunity he had to study with Buxtehude, nick-named the 'Great Dane.' J.S. Bach's Mighty Motets

In 1789, almost 40 years after the master's death, the boys choir at St. Thomas Kirche in Leipzig was engaged in a performance of J.S. Bach's great motet for double choir, *Singet dem Herrn nein neues Lied.* A young man in the audience rose in amazement at the music and yelled to the choirmaster 'What's that?' That young man was Mozart, and he spent the afternoon studying scores, lost in deep contemplation over the music of J.S. Bach. The BCC will sing this motet at the November 4th concert.
